THE UNIVERSITY

LUMS is a not-for-profit organisation established in 1985. It has evolved into a leading institution for research and teaching, with its students and faculty working towards solving the grand challenges of South Asia and beyond.

LUMS offers a distinctive academic experience through its 'Learning Without Borders' philosophy, providing an integrated core curriculum across disciplines. Its five schools have nurtured leaders in all spheres of life, spanning across entrepreneurship, economics, biology, mathematics, engineering, education, writing, politics and business.

The University's internationally qualified faculty are experts in their fields. They create an engaging learning environment and foster a mentoring relationship with their students, who are taken on as co-creators in this process. A major hallmark of the pedagogy at LUMS is that it encourages students to apply their knowledge and come up with progressive 21st century solutions. Academic Advising services at the University offer school-focused peer-mentoring programmes, and online resources for faculty advisors and students.

Cutting-edge research at LUMS is positioned to

examine the mission of higher education from the perspective of innovation, continuing education, and social engagement. The centres and institutes at LUMS work in areas ranging from water, energy, and entrepreneurship, to indigenous languages and public policy, among others. Research from faculty is published in prestigious publications all around the world, and their work also informs policymaking at national and regional levels.

Exchange programmes with over 45 international universities provide exciting opportunities for global

learning and cultural interactions, while strong industry-academia linkages open avenues of learning and partnerships to address collective societal challenges.

Making the LUMS experience accessible to bright students from across Pakistan, regardless of their financial circumstances, is a top priority. As a result, the University prides itself on being home to scholars of diverse backgrounds and unique perspectives, embodying the values of diversity, tolerance, and inclusion.

LUMS has also ushered in a new era of learning in the region by offering

interactive online learning models. LUMSx provides online learning and professional development by leveraging technology and innovative pedagogy.

NOT-FOR-PROFIT STATUS

LUMS is a federally chartered university and is approved as a not-for-profit organisation under Section 2 (36) of Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 in terms of provisions of Clause 63 of Part IV of Second Schedule to the Ordinance. Any individual or organisation making donations to LUMS is entitled to a tax credit under Section 61 of Income Tax Ordinance, 2001. Moreover, the University has been granted exemption from the levy of income tax under Section 159 of the Ordinance, thus, tax is not deductible on payments made to the University.

Pakistan is the world's fifth-most populous nation. The country is a dense mix of natives impacted by successive waves of migrations of Aryans, Persians, Greeks, Pashtuns, Mughals, and Arabs. With 73 languages spoken here, Pakistan is a rich amalgamation of history, culture, dialects, climates and terrain.

It is one of the few regions that annually experience all four seasons. Located on the western end of the great Indo-Gangetic Plain, about three-fifths of Pakistan's area consists of rough mountainous terrain and plateaus, and the remaining two-fifths comprise a wide expanse of level plains. This diversity of flora and fauna makes Pakistan an attractive tourist

destination. The north is home to the mighty K2 and the Nanga Parbat, which are frequented by thousands of mountaineers each year. On the southwestern coast of Balochistan is the scenic city of Gwadar, located on the shores of the Arabian Sea.

Pakistan is a fertile land with many rivers. With a length of over 3,000 metres, River Indus is the longest river in Pakistan. Five major rivers run through the entire country and meet in the Punjab province, which is why it is called 'Panjaab', or the land of five rivers.

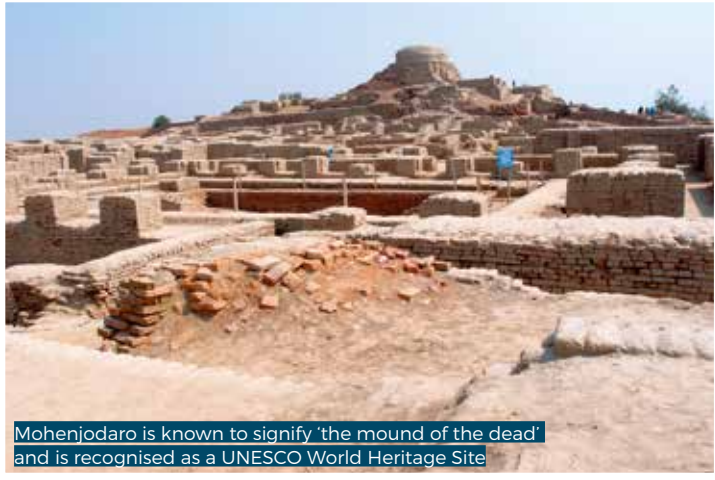
Most of the ancient Indus Valley civilisation's important cities are in Pakistan. The region was the realm of multiple empires and

dynasties, including Alexander the Great's Macedonian Empire, the Mughal Empire, the Sikh Empire, the British East India Company, and the British Raj.

While Karachi is Pakistan's largest city and financial centre, Lahore is its cultural capital and the centre of Pakistani higher education.

The oldest educational institution

of Pakistan, the University of ancient Takshashila in Taxila, dates to the 10th century BC and was attended by many Buddhist and Indian scholars.

and the Sheesh Mahal—a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

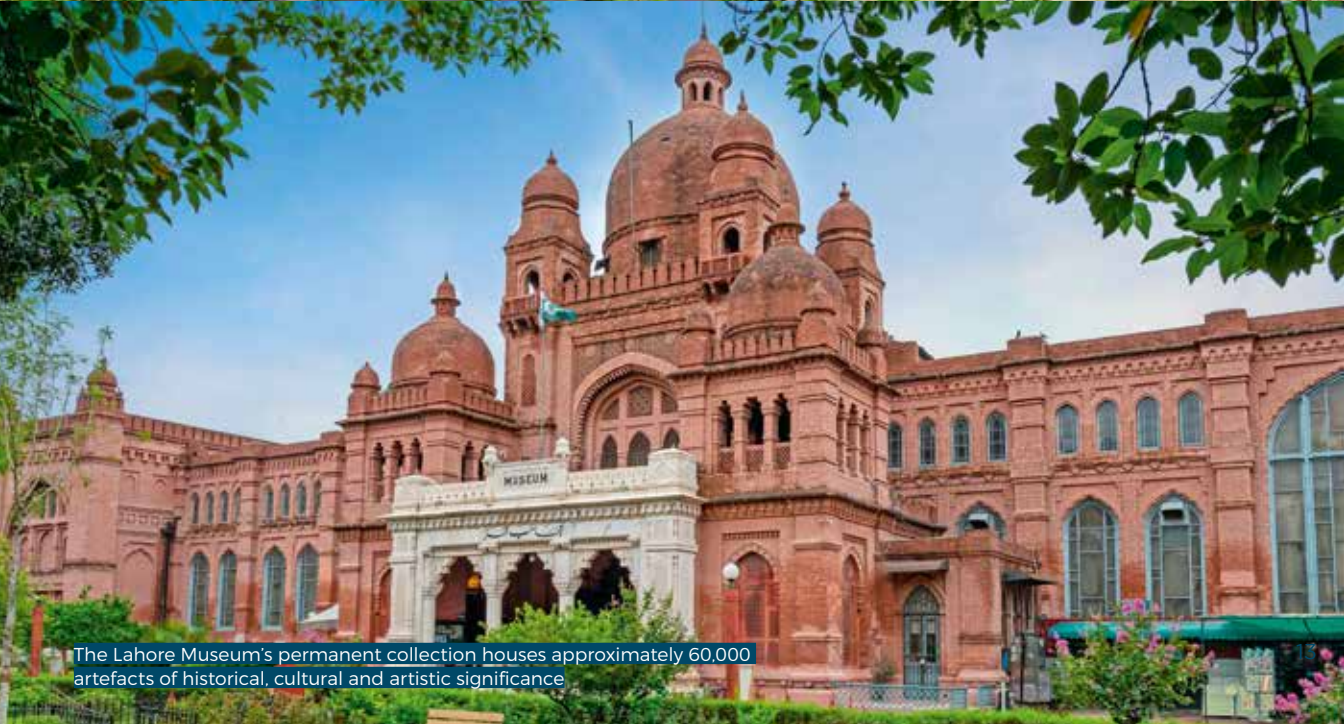

OUR SCHOOLS

Through rigorous programming and an emphasis on research and scholarship, the five schools at LUMS provide students with a rich educational environment.

Faculty work closely with students, who curate and customise their educational trajectory. Students can choose from a variety of undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral degrees, and can pick courses from different schools and departments. The wide range of choices allows each student to develop a holistic perspective towards their field of study, and this transdisciplinary approach is key to innovation and discovery at LUMS.

SULEMAN DAWOOD SCHOOL OF BUSINESS (SDSB)

Since its inception, SDSB has produced exceptionally capable and skilled graduates who have consistently demonstrated their ability to lead, drive transformation, and create long-lasting changes in business and society. It is the first business school in Pakistan to be accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of

Business (AACSB) International. In 2024, AACSB International extended the accreditation of SDSB degree programmes for the next six years following a thorough Continuous Improvement Review evaluation. This extension reflects the high quality of business education provided by SDSB, placing it among the top 6% of

business schools worldwide.

According to the QS World University Rankings (2024), SDSB is ranked number one in Pakistan for Business and Management Studies. The School's Accounting and Finance programme is globally ranked at 101-150, making it the first business school in Pakistan to achieve a ranking in

this subject area. Furthermore, SDSB is the only business school from Pakistan to be ranked in the QS Global MBA Rankings, and its MBA is ranked among the top 35 MBA programmes in Asia and among the top 201-250 in the world. The Executive MBA (EMBA) programme is ranked among the top 14 EMBA programmes in Asia and within the top 111-120 in the world.

A pioneer of the case method pedagogy in Pakistan, SDSB is committed to providing a transformative learner experience that is rigorous and relevant. Recognised as a Harvard Business Publishing content partner, the School boasts one of the largest collections of indigenous business case studies in the country. The School is known for its high-quality and impactful research, and SDSB faculty members are actively engaged with business and society through executive education and consultancy projects.

SDSB is committed to creating a lasting impact through its innovative programmes and research initiatives. To further this aim, it has several dedicated centres that drive both academic excellence and

societal impact. The Rausing Executive Development Centre (REDC) offers executive education designed to advance professionals into more well-rounded leaders through case-based teaching and hybrid pedagogies. The Centre is renowned for its transformative learning experiences that significantly enhance both individual and organisational performance. The Centre for Islamic Finance (CIF) has a mission to provide thought leadership to impact the academic discipline and practice of Islamic finance. The Centre for Business and Society (CBS) bridges the gap between business and societal impact. It

focuses on fostering dialogue, policy development, and engagement through research, capacity building and impact projects. With an emphasis on sustainable development and social responsibility, CBS drives positive change in Pakistan by addressing key areas such as education, gender equality, health, and entrepreneurship.

SDSB offers a comprehensive portfolio of graduate programmes that includes MBA and Executive MBA programmes, specialised MS programmes, and a PhD in Management. Additionally, the undergraduate BSc in Accounting and Finance and Management Science programmes are designed to provide solid foundations in business knowledge and competencies, preparing market-ready graduates.

Through these offerings, SDSB is not only delivering exceptional business education but also influencing the practice of management and fostering positive societal transformation.

MUSHTAQ AHMAD GURMANI SCHOOL OF HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES (MGSHSS)

Over the last few decades, MGS HSS has revolutionised the way social sciences and humanities are taught in Pakistan. Today the School's reputation as a premier academic institution producing research on Pakistan in humanities and social sciences is firmly established. With over 60 full-time PhDs, 21 in Economics alone, the faculty continue

to publish in internationally acclaimed presses and amongst the leading journals in their fields. Research from MGS HSS is globally recognised and feted. In the last year alone, over 40 academic publications and five books have been published.

The School offers a comprehensive liberal arts curriculum with majors in

anthropology and sociology, comparative literature and creative arts, economics, economics and mathematics, economics and politics, English, history, and political science, in addition to a Master's programme in economics.

The modern world is beset with challenges that are multi-faceted—be it poverty,



terrorism, pandemics or climate change. To understand and address these issues requires a holistic understanding, a broad foundation of knowledge and a diverse set of transferable skills.

On graduation, students from MGSHTS have obtained admission into some of the best international universities for further studies. The School has had the highest number of Fulbright scholarships across LUMS. It also has three Rhodes Scholars in the last decade.

Apart from academia, MGSHTS graduates are much sought-after in the job market, and enter career paths of their choice, be it in the corporate sector, business and finance, NGOs, media, teaching, or continuing on in further education. This is because the academic programme emphasises both hard discipline-specific expertise, as well as a range of soft skills which are increasingly in demand amongst employers, including analytical, communication and leadership skills. Graduates have also gone into areas where they are bringing real change to society as film makers, writers, academics, entrepreneurs, and civil servants. Over 6,000 of the



The School's core curriculum ensures that all students acquire knowledge and understanding by delving into works on politics, scientific reasoning, sociology, economics, culture, religion, art, literature, and aesthetics.

19,837 LUMS alumni today are from MGSHTS. Almost half of the 6,000 are women, 75% of whom are part of the workforce.

MGSHTS currently consists of two departments: Economics; and Humanities and Social Sciences. In addition, the School houses three interdisciplinary centres - the Curmani Centre for Languages and Literature, the Saida Waheed Gender Initiative, and the Mahbub ul Haq Research Centre.

SYED BABAR ALI

SCHOOL OF SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING (SBASSE)

SBASSE is unique in Pakistan for the breadth and depth of the scientific and technical education it delivers. Eliminating many of the traditional boundaries between science, mathematics and engineering gives students a richer learning environment and enables our

faculty to deliver world-leading innovation and research that address many of society's most pressing challenges. We study issues as varied as climate, urbanisation, health informatics, human-computer interaction, nanoscience, and quantum technology.

Exciting discoveries are

made, and new scholarship is created in academic departments devoted to disciplines such as physics, life sciences, and electrical engineering, as well as at our interdisciplinary research centres. For example, the LUMS Energy Institute works with the energy and power



sector of Pakistan, providing interdisciplinary research to support power and energy planning, renewable energy technologies, and grid modernisation. Meanwhile, the Centre for Water Informatics and Technology works closely with industry and the government on developing technologies to improve irrigation efficiency and introduce sustainable agricultural practices. The work of the Centre for Urban Informatics, Technology, and Policy contributes to urban policy development, while the Technology for People Initiative delivers applied research using computer science to address societal problems.

The School offers a four-year undergraduate Bachelor of Science programme where students can specialise ('major') in mathematics, physics, chemistry, life sciences, chemical engineering, electrical engineering, or computer science. We also offer a joint honours programme in economics and a range of complementary qualifications



Fundamental and applied research are key to the SBASSE experience, and by working with our faculty, students can also take part in cutting-edge research activities in over 70 dedicated labs for research, teaching and support.

('minors') in topics such as computer engineering or quantum technology. Students are encouraged to learn from courses from across SBASSE, as well as from other schools. At the graduate level, we offer Master of Science and PhD degrees that provide students with the opportunity to deepen their knowledge and develop their professional and research skills. The School's students develop a flexible mindset and a diverse range of skills that positions them to become future leaders in science, technology and other fields.

SHAIKH AHMAD HASSAN SCHOOL OF LAW (SAHSOL)

SAHSOL's five-year BA-LL.B degree, accredited by the Pakistan Bar Council and the Higher Education Commission, Pakistan, features a two-year interdisciplinary BA phase, exposing students to various disciplines at LUMS. The subsequent three-year LL.B phase involves fundamental and specialised law courses. The curriculum at the School is meticulously crafted to meet

key learning objectives in core legal areas. Students have the flexibility to choose from a variety of elective courses across five streams: Government, Law and Citizenship, Criminal Law, Business Law, Legal Theory, and International and Comparative Law.

The use of the Socratic Method encourages students to participate in dynamic

discussions, enhancing their critical thinking and analytical reasoning abilities. Beyond classroom learning, practical training is a crucial element of this degree. Experiential learning extends to on-site visits to courts and law firms, providing firsthand experiences that enrich students' understanding of the legal landscape.



Alongside, SAHSOL's Advisement Cell, Legal Writing Lab, the Annual Networking Session with prospective employers and the Alumni Mentorship Programme provide academic and professional guidance to students. The recently established LUMS Law Clinic deepens student learning through legal practice, as well as expands the availability of legal services to various marginalised populations in and around Lahore.

The School also houses the Centre for Chinese Legal Studies. Aimed at being a regional hub for shared legal resources between Pakistan and China, academics, students, and legal and business professionals in both countries are facilitated to exchange knowledge and build capacity and legal expertise through the Centre.

SAHSOL's faculty ensure that students are intellectually engaged and capable of contributing to academic and policy debates and initiatives. They head projects and work collaboratively with the American Bar Association, the UNHCR and government agencies such as Punjab Prisons, the Social Welfare Department and others.



The lessons learnt from pioneering a novel and rigorous programme of legal education are now being shared broadly with members of other law faculties from across the

country through a pedagogical training programme, in partnership with the Pakistan Bar Council and with the Law and Justice Commission of the Supreme Court of Pakistan.

Law majors benefit from legal internships, contributing to the LUMS Law Journal, participating in international moot court competitions and pro bono work through clinics such as the Street Law Programme.

The School's graduates have gained recognition as leaders in the corporate sector, partners in esteemed law firms, advocates for public interest causes, and contributors to the government sector and legal academia. They have also excelled in the Central Superior Services exams. Many graduates have gone on to pursue higher education at top universities around the world, receiving prestigious scholarships.

SYED AHSAN ALI AND SYED MARATIB ALI **SCHOOL OF EDUCATION (SOE)**

Through its comprehensive programmes, SOE produces strategic leaders, policy researchers, and reflective practitioners who are geared towards directing a vibrant education reform agenda for Pakistan.

The School offers four interdisciplinary minors in Education, alongside two MPhil programmes in Education Leadership and Management: a regular track and a weekend track for executives. The programmes feature

extensive field engagement and operate at the nexus of research, policy and practice.

The School also helps students reach their full potential through the numerous individual interviews, advising sessions, and networking



events conducted by the SOE Career Placement Programme.

SOE provides professional education solutions to educators in various stages of their careers. The solutions are offered at the individual level through courses, trainings, workshops and certifications, as well as at the organisational level through custom programmes.

Faculty at SOE actively engages at the national level. They are part of the government's education task forces, boards of public-private partnerships, and autonomous bodies in the government. They also lead policy roundtables with multiple stakeholders on issues of national importance.

With graduates that are well-equipped to diagnose and solve real-world problems in public and private schools, SOE is well on its way to creating sustainable and much needed change in classrooms across Pakistan.

MPhil candidates participate in the Practicum Programme, a mandatory, intensive semester long 'residency' rooted in field-based research during which students are placed in educational organisations that have partnered with SOE.



LIFE AT LUMS

Students at LUMS are encouraged to pursue their passions and try new things. It is the perfect place to experience campus life with 37 clubs and societies that offer something that piques everyone's interest—from arts and social work to sports and technology.

These societies offer students a place to express themselves, learn new skills, and meet like-minded people. They also provide opportunities to represent the country at international forums. Many of our

student delegations have made a mark at prestigious competitions, such as the Harvard Model United Nations and the World Youth Festival in Sochi, Russia.

The University also offers various sports activities and programmes to keep its community members physically and mentally fit.

Students are encouraged to consider optional curricular opportunities, such as free electives, minors, independent research, semesters abroad, and senior projects and theses. This

variety of additional choices enables each student at LUMS to create a unique academic experience for themselves.

Experiential learning, through internships, practicums, and pedagogical partnerships, is a distinctive feature at LUMS.

The University's Pedagogical Partnership Programme is the first of its kind in South Asia and provides students with paid partnerships. These involve active collaboration with faculty and staff to design courses, offer





feedback on teaching, engage in research, and collaborate with service units on campus.

Meanwhile, the inclusive environment at LUMS fosters a strong sense of belonging, contributing to a dynamic university experience.

No matter where students come from, or where they are headed, at LUMS they find a home and a community that encourages, supports, and inspires.



THE CAMPUS AND FACILITIES

The 100-acre, modern LUMS campus is a beautiful place, where one lays the groundwork for lifelong connections and friendships.

From physical to mental health, personal well-being is a priority at the University. The Syed Maratib Ali Sports Complex and the Coca-Cola Aquatic Centre offer state-of-the-art sports

facilities that help students maintain an active lifestyle.

The Counselling and Psychological Services department has experienced counsellors on board, working under the supervision of a licensed clinical psychologist, to meet the mental health needs of the community. In addition, the Health and Wellness Centre on

campus is equipped to provide emergency medical services to all.

The daycare offers a homegrown curriculum designed by School of Education students including activities that aim to enhance children's social, motor, and creative skills.

AN ECOSYSTEM OF LEARNING

True to its philosophy of 'Learning Without Borders', LUMS provides invaluable educational resources to a wide range of demographics, fostering curiosity and promoting growth beyond the traditional university classroom. Through initiatives like the LUMS Learning Institute, LUMSx, Centre for Continuing Education Studies, and LUMS Centre for Entrepreneurship, the University ensures that knowledge is accessible to learners of all ages, academic backgrounds, and professional trajectories.





LUMS Learning Institute

The LUMS Learning Institute (LLI) is dedicated to enhancing teaching, learning, career progression, and pedagogical partnerships within the higher education sector for faculty, staff, and students alike. Over the last four years, it has distinguished itself by offering a wide range of developmental programmes within and outside of LUMS, such as the Faculty Certificate in Teaching and Learning, the Certificate in Health Professions Education, and the Teaching Assistant Development Programme. By utilising modern technologies like generative AI and innovative teaching methods like the 'flipped classroom' model, LLI enriches and diversifies the academic environment at LUMS.

LUMSx

LUMSx is the centre for online learning and professional development at LUMS that leverages technology and innovative pedagogy to bridge critical knowledge and skill gaps. It offers self-paced, hybrid, synchronous (live), and free open online courses in three domains: teaching and education, business and management, and data science and information technology. LUMSx has a diverse team working across six departments: instructional design, visual design, video production, web development, marketing, and market research. It is also home to a state-of-the-art video production studio that makes it an ideal space for creators and educators alike.



Continuing Education Studies

The Centre for Continuing Education Studies (CES) at LUMS extends educational opportunities to learners of various backgrounds and age groups, including high school students, career professionals, and non-traditional learners. The Centre offers courses related to professional and personal development, languages, culture, and arts, among others. Its catalogue includes short evening courses, weekend bootcamps, customised trainings, and a Summer School programme for students aged 8 to 19. All CES courses are designed and delivered by acclaimed industry experts and academics, ensuring high-quality learning for all.



LUMS Centre for Entrepreneurship



The LUMS Centre for Entrepreneurship (LCE) is a dynamic hub of learning that addresses the multifaceted needs of Pakistan's entrepreneurial ecosystem. It offers a wide range of services, including incubation programmes, acceleration activities in collaboration with global partners, workshops, support services, and trainings. LCE also houses a Makers Lab, a suite of five state-of-the-art labs that allows entrepreneurs and researchers access to facilities that help them prototype innovative products. Having enabled over 2,500 jobs for clients from diverse industries, LCE reflects LUMS' broad vision and commitment to collaboration, creativity, and entrepreneurship.

The faculty at LUMS conduct multidisciplinary research to expand human knowledge and address global challenges. Working side-by-side with students, they advance scholarship in the realm of artificial intelligence, law and policy, renewable energy, pedagogical intervention, and many other fields.

Research has been conducted in areas as diverse as water and waste management, renewable energy, forest fire detection, women's economic empowerment, teaching practices, and healthcare.

Faculty at the University are regularly published in leading academic journals, and they collaborate with high-ranking think tanks, policymakers, government committees, and research institutes around the world. Books, edited volumes, and case studies by faculty members are also used across mainstream academics and for trainings at national institutions.

Faculty have also received numerous awards and grants from organisations such as TikTok, Google, European Climate Foundation, and UNHCR, testifying to the quality of their research.

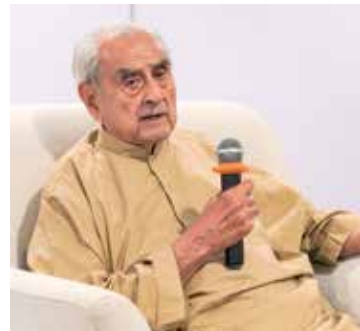

The National Outreach Programme (NOP) is an embodiment of LUMS' core principles of diversity and accessibility. The NOP is a unique initiative making quality education accessible to those belonging to underserved areas across Pakistan. To date, 1,561 students have been recruited for the Programme from 162 cities, towns, and villages.

The NOP offers up to 140% scholarship, which covers tuition, books, living stipends, and lodging. The impact of the scholarship on the scholars and their communities is far-reaching. Many scholars become the first to graduate

in their families and go on to avail prestigious academic and professional opportunities.

Since its inception in 2001, 1,171 NOP students have graduated; 60 of them have received scholarships in top universities worldwide while others are holding leading positions in national and international companies.

Remarkably, many NOP graduates have been inspired to launch local enterprises that create sustainable social impact in their communities, creating a multiplier effect across the country.
